


 - 22 Water and Sediment Control Basins Installed

- Up To 90% Cost Share Funds Available
- Federal Funds Leveraged - \$300,004
- 1W1P Funds Expended - \$410,361



Clean Water Fund – Snakey Creek




- Years of neglect along the 2600' long Snakey Creek (outlet for County Ditch #41 - north Moorhead) prompted a State CWF application between Clay SWCD & BRRWD in the amount of \$400,000
- Completed in 2025
 - Estimated Pollution Reductions:
 - 1404 tons/year sediment
 - 1615 lbs/year Phosphorus






The Local Water Management Program is a voluntary program that requires counties to use local task forces to develop and implement water plans based on their priorities.

- Presently - 79 Registered Feedlots in Clay County
- MPCCA Requires Livestock Operations to Re-register Every 4 Years
- MPCCA Requires 7% of Registered Feedlots to be Inspected Yearly for Compliance
