

MULTI CASUALTY INCIDENT MCI RESPONSE

Definition of an MCI: Any incident where five (5) or more ambulances are needed.

Fire departments may dispatch an alarm as a MCI if initial information they receive leads them to believe that it is warranted (such as ten or more victims). Or the first unit on the scene may request a MCI be initiated.

During this type of incident, ambulances from all districts are available to respond. Ambulances can be requested from FM Ambulance and Barnesville Ambulance as needed. Command will need to establish triage and transportation as well as other sectors at these types of incidents.

MCI's will be dispatched in five levels:

- Level #1 - When the request for an MCI is received by fire alarm they will dispatch five (5) ambulances as well as the Fire Chief and all EMS.
- Level #2 When the request for an MCI level two (2) is received by fire alarm they will dispatch five (5) ambulances as well as all EMS.
- Level #3 When the request for an MCI level three (3) is received by fire alarm they will dispatch five (5) ambulances as well as all EMS.
- Level #4 When the request for an MCI level four (4) is received by fire alarm they will dispatch five (5) ambulances as well as all EMS.
- Level #5 When the request for an MCI level five (5) is received by fire alarm they will dispatch five (5) ambulances as well as all EMS.
